The NASCAR and ARCA series are the elite stock car series in the country; which means you must first qualify to compete in them. At the age of 2, and in just his third full year of racing, Jerick was qualified for the NASCAR Busch Series.

After going to school in Minnesota, Jerick decided to venture to Moberly, MO where he had the opportunity to experience and pursue his dream of becoming a professional race car driver. In Jerick's rookie season as a Late model driver in 2001, he was not only Rookie of the Year, but also went on to be the Mizzou Speedway Track Champion and A.M.C.O. Racing Series points Champion. As an encore to his rookie year, Jerick went on to successfully defend his titles as 2002 Mizzou Speedway Track Champion and 2002 A.M.C.O. Racing Series Points Champion. In these two seasons Jerick pursued racing in a career type manner traveling as much as he could earning victories across the country in Minnesota, Iowa, and Florida. By competing at various tracks across the nation Jerick was preparing to adapt to a traveling series such as NASCAR.

Competitors noticed when Jerick's team arrived at the track and recognized that he is one of the top contenders. With this in mind, Jerick assisted in forming Team Johnson Motorsports, in order to bring that same effect to the NASCAR garages.

Team Johnson Motorsports is now located in Mooresville, NC. Jerick and the team have tested at tracks such as Daytona International Speedway, Lowe's Motor Speedway, Nashville Speedway, Kansas Speedway, Dover's Monster Mile, and Kansas Speedway, all on the Busch Series schedule, to gain experience. Jerick also drove as a stunt driver in a movie called Alan Kulwicki Dare to Dream. In the movie he drove the Underbird, a car that took Alan Kulwicki to his first NASCAR Winston Cup Championship.

In 2006, Jerick is running for the Busch Series Rookie of the Year and is very excited to promote and help his sponsors get the exposure in racing they deserve.
